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What is the Community Support Services Program?

The Community Support Services program provides services that promote community integration to Bergen County residents who have serious and persistent mental illness and who possess the desire and ability to live and participate independently in their community. The Community Support Services program offers:

- Community Support Services
- Recreation/Socialization
- Knowledge about transportation options
- Building life skills
- Supportive Counseling
- Advocacy/Service Linkages
- Housing referrals & Support

Who does the Community Support Services Program help?

The Community Support Services Program serves persons over the age of 18 who are Bergen County residents and have a serious and persistent mental illness.

Who runs the Community Support Services Program?

The Community Support Services program is staffed by experienced community support specialists. We have staff scheduled 7 days per week, and available during all business hours.



Who pays for the services provided by the Community Support Services Program?

The Community Support Services Program is funded by the New Jersey Division of Mental Health and Addiction Services. Medicaid is billed for services rendered to consumers that have Medicaid coverage. However, consumers that do not have Medicaid coverage are not denied services. Services are provided at no cost to the consumer.
